Specializing in doo-wop from of the '50s and '60s from the streets of Philadelphia and Brooklyn, the Flipsydz ("Flip Sides") will be bringing that timeless sound to Saratoga.

Three generations of singers, including Don Tosti (baritone/tenor) Tom Torebka (bass/baritone) Pete Avilles (tenor/baritone) and Stan Simkins (tenor/falsetto), the local group has a CD called "Hangin' On The Corner With The Flipsydz" and has performed at Proctors, Saratoga Racetrack, Saratoga National Golf Course, Saratoga First Night and of course, the upstate home of doo-wop, Caffe Lena.

Be it a lush "Two Silhouettes on the Shade" or the joyful "Up On The Roof," this quartet knows how to blend perfectly and seamlessly. The big question is if there will be a protest at the famed folk music spot because there will be four singers and not one guitar?
